Dr. Ellen L. Frost, a Visiting Fellow at the Institute for International Economics and an Adjunct Research Fellow at the National Defense University, is an author and frequent speaker on international affairs. Her government experience includes the State Department, the Senate, the Treasury Department, the Defense Department, and the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, where she served as Counselor (1993-95). She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations in New York and the Institute for International Strategic Studies in London.

Dr. Frost has made presentations at numerous academic conferences and U.S. government training programs. Besides her many articles and conference papers, she is the author of three books: *Asia's New Regionalism* (2008), *Transatlantic Trade: A Strategic Agenda* (1997), and *For Richer, For Poorer: The New U.S.-Japan Relationship* (1987). She also co-edited *The Global Century: Globalization and National Security* (2001), published by the National Defense University.

Her teaching experience includes graduate seminars on globalization and development and an adult education course on the history of modern China, as well as lectures at the World Affairs Council, the Great Decisions program, and local universities.
