

HOMAN, THOMAS A.

Thomas A. Homan was a career Foreign Service Information Officer with the United States Information Agency from 1970-95. Tom served in Beirut, Kuwait, Cairo, Amman and Baghdad, where he was CPAO 1979-80. In Washington Tom was Deputy Director of NEA/P at the State Department before going to West Berlin as IO then BPAO 1984-88. From 1988-92 Tom was DPAO in Islamabad, then Deputy Director of NEA at USIA 1992-94 when he was named CPAO Delhi.

Following retirement in 1995 Tom taught American history at the National Languages University of Kazakhstan and at the Almaty International School. At the Woodstock International School in India (1996-98) he taught history, international affairs and political philosophy.

From 1998-2001 Tom was program director at the Minnesota World Affairs Council and a Great Decisions speaker. In 2001 Tom was asked to lead a globalization effort at The College of St. Scholastica in Duluth, Minnesota. He also teaches about Middle East diplomacy at the University for Seniors, a part of the University of Minnesota. Tom's opinion columns on foreign affairs are carried in Minnesota regional newspapers and in the on-line Journal of American Diplomacy. He has been asked to speak at Princeton University, George Washington University, United International College in Zhuhai, China, and at the Foreign Service Institute, mostly on public affairs in the Middle East and South Asia.
