



Vivian Walker is currently a professor of strategic and security studies at the National Defense College of the UAE and a visiting professor at the Near East South Asia Center for Strategic Studies at the National Defense University. In her 26-year career with the State Department, she twice served as a Deputy Chief of Mission (Croatia and Armenia), twice as an Office Director (Southeastern Europe and EUR's Office of Press and Public Diplomacy), a Public Affairs Officer (Kazakhstan, with coverage of Tajikistan and Turkmenistan), a Cultural Affairs officer (Tunisia) and an Information Officer (Haiti). Other assignments include a two-year professorship in strategic studies at the National War College, a yearlong stint as the regional border coordinator in Afghanistan, and a fellowship on the US Atlantic Council, where she led the first interagency discussion on public diplomacy post 9/11. Ms. Walker graduated from Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service and earned her doctorate in English language and literature from the University of Chicago. She speaks French, Russian and Croatian.
